Arts in Education

American Players Theatre - 2025 In-Classroom Residencies for Dane County Schools

Award: \$1,779

In-classroom residency programs, led by APT Teaching Artists, infuse students with enthusiasm for literary works, equip them with tools to approach challenging literature, such as poetry and Shakespeare, and instill in them the confidence to express themselves with language.

David Alvarez - Gil - Tras las huellas del lince ibérico - A Photographic Travelling Exhibit Across Dane County

Award: \$887

Tras las huellas del lince ibérico is a bilingual traveling photography exhibit by David Álvarez Gil, showcasing stunning images of the endangered Iberian Lynx and local wildlife to inspire environmental awareness and cultural connection across Dane County.

Little Picassos - Little Picassos Art Program 2026

Award: \$1,870

Little Picassos is a free after school art enrichment program for underserved, low-income children primarily living in transitional or subsidized housing in Madison, Wisconsin. Little Picassos has been a thriving program for the past ten years.

Madison Contemporary Dance - Youth Creative Movement Project

Award: \$1,701

Weekly dance classes and performances for underserved youth. Children will train with Sara Rohs, Papa Kobina Brewoo, Tyra Lex and Kristen Hammer to study ballet, jazz, contemporary, hip-hop, breakdancing, and tumbling, focusing on community, confidence and finding their creative voice.

Madison Reading Project - Community Stories Project

Award: \$1,734

Community Stories Project will bring large print books featuring diverse creators and characters to spaces where art and literacy opportunities are needed most throughout Dane County that increase reading engagement and ongoing access to an art and literacy experience.

Madison Symphony Orchestra Inc. - Spring Young People's Concert 2026

Award: \$1,781

The Spring Young People's Concert is a live classical music concert by a professional symphony orchestra, specifically designed for high school students. The concert is performed by the MSO in Overture Hall and features a solo by the student winner of the MSO's Bolz Young Artist Competition.

Monroe Street Arts Center - Aspiring Artists & Musicians

Award: \$1,306

Aspiring Artists & Musicians is a free, inclusive program for ages 0-5. Children of all abilities explore music, movement, and art in a supportive setting co-led by MSAC instructors and therapists, encouraging creativity and developmental growth through joyful, accessible experiences.

Music con Brio, Inc. - Music con Brio's 14th Annual Community Concert Series

Award: \$1,811

Music con Brio proudly presents our 14th Annual Community Concert Series, integrating our Music by Black Composers project. These free concerts pair our students with diverse local professional musicians, bringing Emerson and the wider community together with unique and enriching musical offerings.

Kanopy Dance Theatre Inc - Divine Mythologies: Anna Sokolow's Epic Odes" and other Luminous Voices"

Award: \$1,476

Madison Ballet - Madison Ballet presents: ChoreograpHER an evening of all female choreography.

Award: \$1,711

Madison Ballet's choreograpHER program uplifts and amplifies the voices of women in dance by commissioning new works exclusively from female-identifying choreographers. This initiative

reflects Madison Ballet's commitment to equity, innovation, and expanding the narratives told through ballet.

Local History

Daniel James Koehn - Driven by Stories: A Community Storytelling Project

Award: \$1,651

Driven By Stories (DBS) captures real-life narratives from Dane County residents through the perspective Daniel Kane-a gay, insomniac Uber driver. Blending written stories with live events, it explores resilience, connection, and identity, fostering empathy and amplifying overlooked voices.

RACE AND PLACE COALITION - This Land: Madison. A Greater Madison and Dane County Local History Project for America's 250th

Award: \$1,684

The project commemorates America's 250th by focusing on stories of everyday people and involving them in collecting and presenting those stories. Participants will assemble layered histories of land, raising awareness about the places that surround them.

Multidisciplinary Arts/Culture

Chrysalis, Inc. - Shared Threads: Stories That Weave Us Together

Award: \$1,153

Shared Threads celebrates the art of storytelling and fosters connections across Dane County. Hosted by Chrysalis, the event features diverse storytellers-clients, staff, community-Sharing lived experiences of growth, recovery, authenticity, and resilience. Through storytelling, we stitch together.

Culture Trip LLC - Recetas con Raíces: Cooking Latinidad from Dane County to the World Award: \$1,600

A multigenerational community recipe book celebrating Latin American flavors and stories passed down through families, uniting Dane County residents by sharing cultural heritage and cherished culinary traditions.

From The Front Row - *The Heart of the Earth*

Award: \$1,056

The Heart of the Earth is a live choral event presented by the Madison Choral Project and From The Front Row at Cave of the Mounds. Celebrating nature with earth-themed works, this program will be live-recorded in the North Cave with a small in-person audience, and a free live-stream.

Jeff Oloizia - Writing Forward podcast

Award: \$711

Writing Forward is a podcast featuring in-depth conversations with writers from or based in Wisconsin, exploring their work, creative process, and connection to place. Each episode offers a fresh look at the region's rich literary landscape through the voices shaping it.

LATINOS ORGANIZING FOR UNDERSTANDING AND DEVELOPMENT INC - *I Didn't Know there Were Latinos in Wisconsin*

Award: \$1,195

I Didn't Know There Were Latinos in Wisconsin is a groundbreaking series of three anthologies that amplify the voices of Latino writers and poets across Wisconsin. Curated by Oscar Mireles, former Poet Laureate of Madison the newest collection will feature 50 new Latino poets/writers.

Madison Area Technical College - Expressions of Us: A Collective Canvas

Award: \$1,690

This three-part arts initiative uplifts transformative power of expression by celebrating art and spoken word. Through gallery exhibitions, live performances, and a poetry slam workshop led by award-winning artist Abyss Graham, the series fosters community connection.

Madison Northside Planning Council, Inc. - Voices from the Community: Madison's Food System Award: \$1,812

Madison Northside Planning Council will produce podcast series that look deeper into parts of our regional food system including "Voices of the 718: Surviving in Madison's Hungriest Food Desert" and "Dane County Farmers: Rising to the Challenge", and "FEED Kitchens' Table Talk"

Noah Bloedorn - The Shallot: Journal of Mental Health, Art, and Literature

OFTY presents its 16th annual Family Opera Day on March 31st, 2025 featuring two performances of The Magic Flute in the Playhouse Theater. Complementary workshops in design, music, and movement precede the performance in the Rotunda Theater, put on with assistance from the Madison Youth Choirs.

TNW Ensemble Theater, Inc. - The Rhythm Project

Over 3,000 area youth participate in school field trips, with tickets and busing underwritten by the Film Festival, with support provided by Dane Arts.
